**FUSION Note – (U//FOUO) Great Plains Tar Sands Resistance Rally to Protest Devon Energy**

**WHEN:** September 12, 2013

**WHAT:** (U//FOUO) The Oklahoma Information Fusion Center (OIFC) has received information that on September 12, 2013, the Great Plains Tar Sands Resistance (GPTSR) called on supporters to “Rally for RESISTANCE! w/ Great Plains Tar Sands Resistance”, on Friday, September 13, 2013, at Walker and Sheridan, in downtown Oklahoma City.

According to this report, GPTSR will hold a rally “to RESIST the continued support of the tar sands industry by Devon Energy Corps, the Oklahoma State Government, and the United States Federal Government. Let’s COME TOGETHER and RAISE OUR VOICES in RESISTANCE!” Additionally, there will be a planning meeting , September 12, 2013, at 7:00 p.m., in Oklahoma City (specific location unknown).

Previous direct action incidents committed in Oklahoma by individuals claiming to be associated with groups protesting tar sands have resulted in at least thirty-one (31) arrests.

**OKLAHOMA IMPACT:** (U//FOUO) Due to possible public safety issues, this information is being provided for your situational awareness. The OIFC will provide updates as warranted. The OIFC is requesting reporting on any incidents that involves criminal activity or suspicious activity in order to have situational awareness and to be able to share that information as appropriate.

**(U) Should such activities appear to present an imminent threat, local law enforcement should be notified.**

**FUSION Note – (U//FOUO) Great Plains Tar Sands Resistance and Tar Sands Blockade Groups are Calling on Supporters to Protest Enbridge’s Flanagan South Pipeline**

**WHEN:** August 28, 2013

**WHAT:** (U//FOUO) On July 16, 2013, the Great Plains Tar Sands Resistance (GPTSR) and the Tar Sands Blockade (TSB) groups posted a sign-up page calling for supporters to resist Enbridge Energy Company, Inc’s Flanagan South Pipeline. According to the invitation posted to the GPTSR Facebook page, “Enbridge will effectively have their own Keystone XL if these pipelines are built. So let’s stop them!” The group further boasts “10 work-stopping actions so far, we’re getting into gear to fight other infrastructure projects! We’re trying to maximize resistance to Tar Sands infrastructure in the Great Plains, but as we move on to fight Enbridge’s Flanagan South Pipeline, we need your support and hard work!”

According to open source information, the 600-mile pipeline will stretch from Flanagan, Illinois, to Cushing, Oklahoma, and construction is scheduled to begin in August 2013. According to Enbridge’s map, the Oklahoma counties affected are: Osage, Washington, Pawnee and Payne. It parallels Enbridge’s already-existing Spearhead Pipeline, which connects at Cushing, Oklahoma. In addition to the pipelines, Enbridge has two existing pump stations along the Spearhead Pipeline.

To date, the Oklahoma Information Fusion Center (OIFC) has been made aware of eleven (11) direct action incidents against the KXL pipeline. These incidents resulted in the arrests of thirty-one (31) individuals involved in criminal activity relating to the construction of the KXL pipeline. In addition to the criminal activities conducted by protestors, the OIFC received one report of suspicious photography at a refinery, and another report of suspicious activity at a refinery. While no one group took credit for the acts, the GPTSR and the TSB both supported the actions on their social media sites, and solicited funds to help with the legal expenses of those arrested persons. Based on the previous direct actions against the KXL pipeline, like-minded individuals may attempt similar actions against the Flanagan South Pipeline and/or assets of Enbridge Energy Inc., or those who are deemed “profiteers.”

**OKLAHOMA IMPACT:** (U//FOUO) The OIFC is not aware of any specific threats to any oil and gas assets in Oklahoma at this time.
